As I started to read Pat Perry's The Edge of Darkness: The Final Battle, I was soon absorbed by Perry's sharp imagery. Her keen ability to infuse fantasy characters with human sensitivities held my interest to the end. Perry has researched her medieval details so thoroughly that her descriptions became paintings in my mind. The Lady of the Sands, Clay, ruler of the elves, and Sara, the half-demon, half elf-girl, were more than take-offs of mythical archetypes to me; they seem to have sprung from the Biblical account of the Nephilim, the Biblical progeny of fallen angels who mated with mortal women. I found the novel totally enjoyable and difficult to put down when my reading was interrupted.

Patricia Perry draws the reader back into her magical world of fantasy with the completion of the final volume of her 'Darkness' trilogy. The time for peace is over as evil casts its shadow over the land of our heroes once more.
