Though this fun story does not have much of a plot, it makes up for it by creating a tangible world of cloud-dwelling elves who work with their hands.

Lidgold provides a detailed description of Sprinkle's contraption and how he fixes it (the machine resembles something between a grain combine and a pasta maker).
